


The Milo Chorister Fund

As key members of the Minster's Music Foundation, the Choristers gain much more than musical expertise: lifelong friends are made, and they discover what it is to achieve extraordinary things at a very young age.

The Choristers make professional singing look easy, but there's a lot going on behind the scenes! It takes **dedication and discipline** – and a whole lot of sandwiches to keep them going before Evensong... They rehearse for almost 8 hours a week, and have weekly singing and instrumental lessons alongside music theory coaching.

We produce **superb musicians**, many of whom go on to achieve success in professional music later in life. We work them hard and they deliver, week in, week out. We're incredibly proud of them.

Who is Milo?

The chorister appeal is inspired by Milo Hogesone, a 15th-century Southwell Chorister. He was the first chorister ever recorded in the Cathedral Archives, in 1469. Who better to be the figurehead of the Chorister Fund! With your help, we will secure the musical legacy begun by Milo over 600 years ago.



Southwell Minster's Chorister Programme currently costs £45,000 a year. That includes the costs of singing lessons, instrumental coaching, safeguarding supervision, chaperoning, and robes.
