*BURLISON AND GRYLLS*. Both John Burlison (1843-91) and Thomas Grylls (1845-1913) were trained in the studios of Clayton and Bell. John Burlison Senior was principal assistant to the architect G G Scott.

At the instigation of the architects G F Bodley and Thomas Garner, Burlison and Grylls founded a stained-glass studio in 1868. At first Garner guided their stained glass work and Bodley trained them as church decorators. Much of their work was done for G G Scott and his son. Their one window in the Minster is on the west side of the Chapel of Christ the Light of the World and shows the Ascension.
