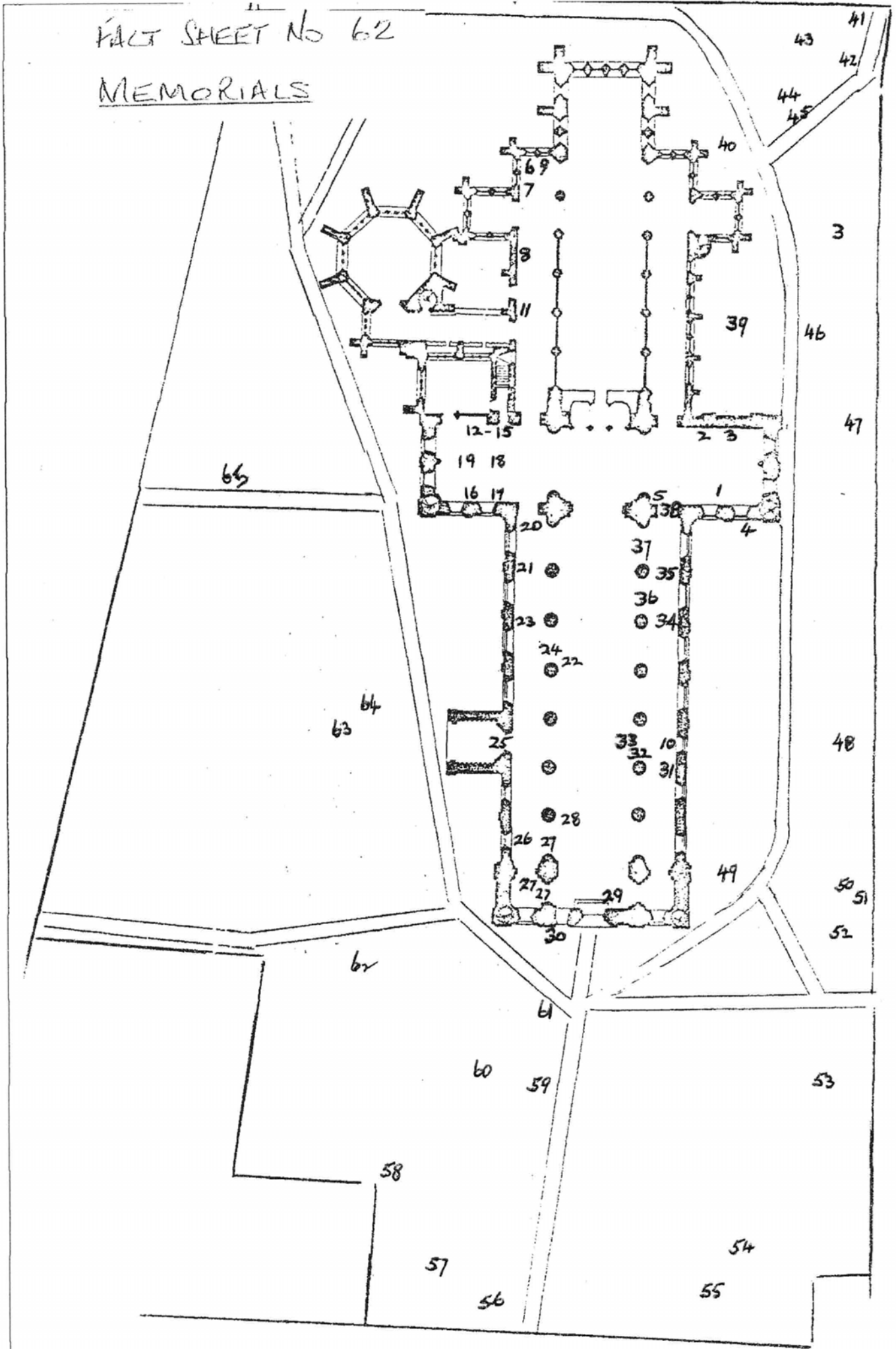

1	Clay, Hutchinson and Leek families: brass plates
2	Rev. Henry Cooke: life history, Ornate with Coat of Arms
3	Rev John Thomas Becher 1769- 1848. One of 9 Bechers buried near Bishop's Chapel
4	Catherine Louise Anson: verse
5 & 6	Barry & Katyn Memorials: same era but only Katyn noted for lettering
7	Talbot memorial also noted for lettering – late 15 th C – c.f. No25 'Tau' Cross
8	Frederick Smith (d 1905) 'Last surviving member of Collegiate Church'
9	Thomas Henry Shepherd (d 1873) (window) 'Last Canon of Collegiate Church'
10	George Wilkins (d 1865) (window) 'Last Canon Residentiary of Coll. Ch.'
11	Bishop Heywood
12	Rev Barry Cooper (d. 1741): Coat of Arms
13	John James Trebeck: 'Rector of this Collegiate Church and its first SubDean when it became a cathedral'
14	Bishop Hoskyns: bust by W. Reynolds- Stephens, words by First Baron of Charnwood
15	Willoughby 1635– 1672. Naturalist: tablet erected 1909
16 & 17	Mary and Ann Perter (d 1810 & 1806) 'short distance...are deposited the remains of'
18	Charles Fowler (d 1778) Vicar Choral
19	Charles Fowler (d. 1840) Vicar Choral for 59 years
20	Rev William and Elizabeth Barrow: high praise
21	Rev Richard Berrow: 64 years Vicar Choral
22	Ann Bugg & Elizabeth <u>Chappel Fowler</u> : (ledger) Note names
23	John Wolley 1823– 1859. Naturalist: tablet erected 1911
24	Ornately carved ledger stone
25	Ledger outside North Door: double use

- 26 Window N20: Charlotte Louise Kinnis: died at sea on passage from Bombay 1847
- 27 Old ledgers; note that with Chalice
- 28 William Brailsford (Ledger stone) Note poem
- 29 Cassandra Chappel: George Chappel tablet on outer wall 30
- 31 William Samuel Sharpe: military memorial
- 32 Broken Ledger stone; Latin inscription
- 33 Gervase Marshal (ledger stone) (d.1776) Receiver General
- 34 Egbert Hacking
- 35 William Wylde: Many more of family outside near wall of Bishop's Manor
- 36 Aldridge: 'Acquired considerable property in East Indies'
- 37 ...Thomas: Much damaged ornate ledger stone
- 38 Popely: one time organist

GRAVESTONES

- 39 Bishops Ridding and Hoskyns: Note Communion Cup
- 40 George Wilkins
- Groupings to South of Minster of prominent families - Becher, Barrow, Clay, Pigott, Townrow and Wright
- 41 Margaret Hall: aged 72 'For 52 years a faithfull servant to the family of Rev J T Becher'
- 42 Richard Dane: aged 49 'Well conducted, industrious labourer'
- 43 Clara Jane widow of 'Counsellor at Law of the City of New York in the USA'
- 44 Grey granite of intricate design
- 45 Walter Scott – Station Master
- 46 Horizontal cross of marble spheres and ropery.
- 47 William Smith-Poem
- 48 Group of ridged stones no longer legible wording: probably clergy

- 49 Elizabeth Pigott
- 50 Several graves of Kirkland family
- 51 Robert Lowe: Noted for farming (d.1822) Restored by Brackenhurst donation
- 52 Chamberlain: Choirboy and Assistant Verger: engraved with a bell
- 53 William Clay: (d. 1775) Poem
- 54 Group of Table Tombs of long lived Maltbys
- 55 Group of graves of the Caudwells
- 56 Mary Murrell's brother
- 57 Group of Merryweather graves
- 58 Forster family graves
- 59 Schumach: Seat used by Bishop in High Altar Sanctuary donated in his memory.
Name given to passageway near and opposite Bramley Apple
- 60 Susanna Wedge: Onetime workhouse matron: eulogy by father
- 61 Fowlers: group of small old headstones (1620, 1700, 1706 & 1711)
- 62 Constance Adelaide Cane: stone erected by friend
- 63 John George Eggleshaw: Southwell Golf Club
- 64 Tom Musgrove: Military and verse
- 65 Sam'l, son of Wm. And Mary Bird: Verse
