# Historic Building Mythbusting

Wednesday 26 June, 2.30–4pm, State Chamber

Join us for an afternoon of history, heritage, myth and legend debunked with Dr James Wright, FSA Buildings Archaeologist.

Go to any ancient building and there will be exciting and romantic stories presented to the visitor. They are commonly believed and widely repeated – but are they really true? These stories include those of secret passages linking ancient buildings, blocked doors in churches which are thought to keep the Devil out, and claims to be the oldest pub in the country.

James will explain the development of such myths and investigate the underlying truths behind them.

# Peter Eugene Ball: An Exhibition of Working Drawings

6 July - 4 August

We are delighted to be hosting an exhibition of world-renowned artist Peter Eugene Ball's working drawings.

Peter's works can be found in over 80 cathedrals (including here in Southwell), churches and other religious buildings.

When a new work is proposed for a religious building, a considerable amount of information must be brought together, not least of all being the answer to the vital question 'what will it look like?'. Working drawings are made to aid visualisation of the initial concept.

This exhibition comprises a selection of Peter's working drawings for sculptures created over a period of several decades.

### King's Birthday Service

We join together with the Lord-Lieutenant, the High Sheriff, and representatives of civic groups and charities from across the county, in a celebration of our communities in all their diversity. The preacher is the Bishop of Southwell and Nottingham, the Rt Revd Paul Williams

**Evensong** takes place every day in the Minster during term time, except on Wednesdays. One of the main features of the service is that most of the parts are sung by the choir, meaning that the congregation is free to sit, to reflect, to pray, to let the music wash over them.






