SERVICES AND FAITH

Live-streaming volunteers needed. Our live-streaming of Sunday services enables those who are unable to be with us in person to share in our worship, whilst also opening up our services to people from across the diocese and beyond. Our livestreaming facility relies on a small group of volunteers, and we are always looking for more people to join the merry band! If you would be willing to be part of this important ministry on a rota basis, please speak with Canon Richard or one of the other clergy. Very little technical knowledge is required, and full training will be given.

Dean Nicola's Final Services and Collection. Dean Nicola's final services in the Minster will be on Sunday 29 September. The Cathedral Eucharist at 10.00am on that day will be a very special occasion, as the last service at which Dean Nicola presides at the Eucharist in the Minster. The main focus for marking the occasion, however, will be the Festal Evensong at 3.30pm, at which the Dean will preach her farewell sermon. All are very warmly invited to join with the Bishop of Southwell and

Nottingham, the Rt Revd Paul Williams, and with other invited guests from around the Diocese and County, as we mark the end of Dean Nicola's ministry in Southwell. Music will be led by the combined forces of the Cathedral Choir and the Minster Chorale, and there will be refreshments following the service. Dean Nicola has led us with such grace and ability through some incredibly testing times, including the Covid-19 pandemic. As a parish and a community we all owe her an immense debt of gratitude and will have an opportunity on 29 September to demonstrate this. MUSIC AND EVENTS CALENDAR

The Longest Yarn, 9–27 September. The Longest Yarn is an 80m 3D depiction of D-Day, 6th June 1944, in wool art. With 80 displays, each measuring one metre in length, depicting scenes of the world's largest amphibious invasion, The Longest Yarn is something quite unique and not to be missed. The scenes include the build-up to D-Day in England, the horrors on the Landing Beaches and the bloody inland battles.

The installation will be first on display in Carentan, France, in May, before coming to Southwell Minster. Admission is free (donations welcome) and tickets are not needed. Please check the website for occasional times where part of the exhibition will be closed to visitors due to funeral services.

Created with guidance from professional historians to be accurate, each scene has been selected by the creator to depict the story of this momentous day in history. Some of the scenes depict actual WW2 veterans that were in the theatre of war in Normandy on 6th June plus the lesser-known events in local towns and villages in Normandy. Over 1,000 knitters from across the world, including the UK, USA, Australia, New Zealand, Canada, France and even people with NATO stationed in Europe, have joined in to help make this project happen. The exhibition is free of charge. An accompanying book will be on sale, giving more information on each of the 80 scenes, including a picture from 1944 to show viewers what each scene was based on. Museum of the Moon, **11–22 October.** After the success of last year's Gaia Earth installation, we are delighted to announce Luke Jerram's Museum of the Moon will be coming to Southwell Minster. Measuring seven metres in diameter, the moon features 120dpi detailed NASA imagery of the lunar surface. At an approximate scale of 1:500,000, each centimetre of the internally lit spherical sculpture represents 5km of the moon's surface. The installation is a fusion of lunar imagery, moonlight and surround sound composition created by BAFTA and Ivor Novello award winning composer Dan Jones. General daytime admission tickets are £4 for adults, £2 for U16s, and U5s are free. Booking online is recommended but not essential, but during busy times those looking to pay on the door may have to wait. Evening sessions are £5 for adults, £3 for U16s, and U5s are free.

Please note tickets for each session are strictly limited so book early to avoid disappointment.

Papagena, Monday 14 October, 7.30pm. No props, microphones or gimmicks, just five stunning voices form Papagena, an a cappella group set up to explore the wealth of music from medieval times to the present day written specifically for female voices. The group's programming defies pigeonholing, juggling folk, medieval, classical and contemporary works with new commissions and the group's own compositions and arrangements. Papagena has performed at numerous festivals including Edinburgh and the Three Choirs, for BBC Radio 3 and 4, Scala Radio and Classic FM, has recorded 3 CDs including "Hush!" and its chart-topping Christmas album "The Darkest Midnight", and enjoys a fruitful collaboration with the Orchestra of the Swan.
