Churches Together in Southwell — Christmas Stall on Southwell Market, Saturday 14 December. The theme of this year's stall will be to remind people that Jesus is the reason for the season and that he was born to save. The stall will emphasise this message with banners and posters, tracks with a Christmas message, and a Nativity scene. There will be many giveaway items to attract people and start conversations. The stall will be manned by volunteers from across the churches, filling one-hour slots from 8am to 1pm. New Rose Vestments. This Sunday sees the first appearance of a new set of rose vestments for clergy and servers, which have been made by our Needlework Guild. Rose (pink) vestments are traditionally used on the third Sunday of Advent (Gaudete Sunday) and the fourth Sunday of Lent (Laetare Sunday, or Mothering Sunday) to symbolise hope and expectation in the midst of the themes of penitence and preparation that characterise Advent and Lent. The creation of these beautiful, handworked vestments has been made possible through the generosity of an anonymous donor, and through the regular support of the Friends of Southwell Cathedral to the Needlework Guild, and has involved no cost to the Minster. We will bless the new vestments in early Lent, in preparation for their second outing on Mothering Sunday.
