THE WEEK AHEAD

Cathedral Carol Services, Monday 23 and Tuesday 24 December, 7.00pm. Our carol service follows the traditional pattern of the famous service at King's College, Cambridge. As well as hearing choral music sung by the Cathedral Choir, there is the chance to sing well-known Christmas carols in a joyful and uplifting setting. The journey to Bethlehem, birth of Jesus, adoration of the shepherds and the coming of the Magi are all part of this festive service of readings and music. This service is un-ticketed and likely to be very popular. We recommend arriving well in advance of the service start time to guarantee a seat with a view.
