Duruflé *Requiem*: Sinfonia Viva with the choirs of Southwell Minster and Coventry, Derby and Leicester Cathedrals, Saturday 8 February, 7.30pm. Maurice Duruflé's *Requiem* is a sublime choral work and a powerful journey through many traditions of sacred music. Written in 1947, it is a relatively recent setting of the Latin *Requiem*, but has a timeless quality built on its incorporation of Gregorian chant. For this concert the orchestra will be joined by the choirs from Southwell Minster, Derby Cathedral, Coventry Cathedral and Leicester Cathedral for an impressive spectacle of the best of Midlands music-making. The programme will also include Vaughan Williams's *Fantasia on a Theme by Thomas Tallis* and Poulenc's *Organ Concerto*. <u>Come & Sing Haydn's Nelson Mass</u>, Saturday 15 February, 9.30am.
