Lent begins on Wednesday 5 March. As well as Lent services, why not try a Lent course? Both services will offer an opportunity to receive the imposition of ashes as a sign of penitence and of our commitment to keeping a holy Lent.

Church Electoral Roll. The Electoral Roll is a list of all the members in a church, who are baptised and who either live in the parish or regularly worship at the church. Being on the Electoral Roll enables you to vote at the Annual Parish Meeting. Every six years the roll has to be completely renewed, and that process begins on Monday 17 February. If you are already on the roll, you will receive an email or a letter asking if you would like to renew your membership and a form to enable you to do so. If you are not already on the roll but would like to be, you can get a form from Maggie Peel, the Electoral Roll Officer, or from the vergers. Completed forms must be returned by Friday 4 April. Maggie will be in the crossing with application forms after services on Sundays 23 February and 2 March if you prefer to complete a form then.

New Chapter Members. I am delighted to announce that, following a rigorous recruitment process, we have appointed four excellent new members of the Cathedral Chapter. They are Ann Carter-Gray, Marion Oswald, David Walker, Jonathan Wheeler. I am awaiting biographies and photos from them, and I will share these as soon as we have them. The four people offer a range of skills including legal, financial, property and governance expertise. All live fairly locally and are excited about offering their expertise and experience for the benefit of Southwell Minster and its mission and ministry in the Diocese of Southwell and Nottingham.

Their terms of office end this year, and elections will take place in May to replace them. All members of the Electoral Roll will be eligible to vote to fill these two posts. MUSIC AND EVENTS

Country by Candlelight, Friday 28 February, 7.30pm.

Threads through the Bible, Friday 7 March to Monday 5 May, Monday – Saturday: 10am–4pm; Sunday: 12.30–3pm. We are delighted to be just the second place in the world to host the artistic masterpiece that is Threads through the Bible by extraordinary textile artist Jacqui Parkinson. Threads through the Bible is made up of three huge sequences, 'Threads through Creation', 'Threads through the Cross' and 'Threads through Revelation' to create one incredible display of textile art. 'Threads through Creation' and 'Threads through Revelation' have been displayed in many cathedrals in Britain: this is the first time they will come together with 'Threads through the Cross'. It's a rare opportunity not to be missed. Taking ten years to create, this 44-panel exhibition is made up of more than 25 million stitches and if presented side by side, would stretch more than 80 metres. Don't miss this powerful and moving display of faith, art, and storytelling and your chance to witness this exceptional journey through the Bible's narrative in silk artistry. Entry: suggested donation of £5 per person or £10 for families. Please see the Minster website for more information, including dates when entry to the exhibition will be limited.

A workshop and talks with Threads artist Jacqui Parkinson. An engaging series of walks and talks around particular panels with the artist will take place on Friday 7 and Saturday 8 March.
